# Luke's Gospel: How The Good News Impacts Culture

Nov. 1st and 15th, 2014 (Saturdays)

## Overview

This one-credit course examines Luke's themes, especially how the author presents Jesus' career as history's most crucial event. Special emphasis will be how the Kingdom overturns the normal social order and how that applies today to the Gospel reversing conventional beliefs. A dual focus is on teaching.

## Objectives

By conclusion of class, students will have a ready grasp of Luke's key themes as well as how to facilitate Bible Study in small groups. Special emphasis will be placed on Luke's unique parables and insight on how to apply them to contemporary culture.

## Activities

The class will be for one credit and meet only twice: two Saturday's, November 1<sup>st</sup> and 15<sup>th</sup>, 2014.

Please read the Gospel of Luke prior to the first class and research basic questions of background and authorship in a favorite commentary. We will share these resources in class for students to be exposed to what is available, how to make selections on scholarship, and especially how to read a text thoughtfully and with ample questions.

Class sessions will be filled with comments from Madelon but equally important will be your own insights.
