## Basic Admissions Requirements

- Master of Divinity, or an equivalent degree(s)
- 3.0 Cumulative GPA from a Master of Divinity degree
- Strong congregational connection, preferably ordained
- Minimum of 3 years since graduating from an M. Div. degree program
- Additional requirements may be requested

## What is a Doctor of Ministry degree?

Pursuing a Doctor of Ministry degree is a time of theological reflection on specific practices of ministry. Develop advanced leadership skills by bringing your ministry experience to an individualized learning program; creating opportunities for critical and imaginative forms of ministry and mission. It is a praxis degree that includes leaving your ministry setting for a short time of learning, and return with new or renewed sets of practical skills. It would take no less than 3 years, and sometimes up to 6 years.



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
